MICHELA CATTAI





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Currently residing in Milan, Italian artist Michela Cattai moved to Venice in 1984, graduating in Painting at the Academy of Fine Arts, under the guidance of Fabrizio Plessi. She also enrolled in a degree in Design, participating in the course "Communicating Vessels" held by Ennio Chiggio, a member of Group N in Padua, thanks to whom she began assimilating the concepts of semantics and semiotics in the field of Italian design, focusing her study on glass. In 1988, she was selected to participate in a collective exhibition at the Murano Glass Museum.

Since 1991, she has been artistic director of her namesake gallery, Galleria Michela Cattai ART+DESIGN, located in the heart of Brera, Milan. Her gallery focuses on the Italian artistic production of the late XX century, with the aim of reconstructing a meaningful dialogue between artistic and design practices. Among some of the most prominent names in the gallery are Vincenzo Agnetti, Gianni Colombo, Paolo Icaro, Gio Ponti, Ico Parisi and Franco Albini, manufacturers of Fontana Arte, Venini.

In 2017, Michela Cattai was invited to present her glass work as a solo exhibition at the Chamber of Deputies, in the Sala del Cenacolo, Rome and again in 2019 at the Italian Cultural Institute of Tokyo, Japan. She has taken part in several solo and group exhibitions (Miami/Design Basel 2017, Expo Chicago 2017/2018, The Venice Glass Week 2017/2018/2019/2020/2021/2023, Galleria Civica Bolzano 2018, Fog Design+Art San Francisco 2019, Nomad St. Moritz 2018/2019, VITREA at the Triennale di Milano in 2021, DoppiaFirma Milano Design Week 2022, Masterpiece London 2022, PAD London Art+Design 2019/2022/2023, Palazzo Contarini Scala del Bovolo Venezia 2023) enlightening the interest of various Italian and foreign museums.

Her works are currently displayed in several international spaces, from the Stiftung Museum Kunst Palast of Düsseldorf to Europeana of DDB (German Digital Library), from Murano Glass Museum to Scuola Grande di San Giovanni Evangelista in Venice, to the Italian Embassy's permanent collection of modern art in Tokyo and to the Carlo Rizzarda Gallery of Modern Art in Feltre. In 2022, she exhibited "Linfa", a series composed of the recycled waste of other artists from the historical Battaglia Foundry in Milan, as part of the collective project "DoppiaFirma" promoted by the Michelangelo Foundation, Fondazione Cologni Maestri d'Arte and Corriere della Sera Living.

In 2019 Michela Cattai took on the position of Art Director for Venini, before devoting herself completely to her work as an independent artist in 2023. Her pieces are integrated into furnishings, selected by multinational curators and decorators. Michela Cattai's glass works are unique pieces of Venetian glass, blown and worked freehand by expert glassmakers who give shape to her conceptions. Her projects pay homage to the heritage of Murano blown glass, reinterpreting it in a new light of contemporary expression whilst the Venice Lagoon and the beauty of its surrounding flora play an integral role in her inspiration.

TRIFORME SERIES 2019



The cromatic choice of this series of glass artworks explains the artist's need to create stylised and minimal shapes through the use of different shades of color. The bronze tones, obtained by the union of different oxydes, shade together until reaching the transparent crystal. The light shades, accentuated by the signs of the grinding, wrap up the primordial shaped sculptures which become "creatures" that invite to be caressed and hold in the arms.

This series is the example of how much is important to the artist to experiment and to go far away from the classical rules of working with Murano blown glass. These abstract shapes, always reminding a triangular element, as a distinguishing symbol of Michela Cattai, are what is the most far from the usual shapes of Murano glass and become unique sculptures with their own identity.

CANNETO SERIES LAGUNA 2016



The focus of Laguna is the importance of the color and its relationship with the light. In these pieces Michela Cattai tries to combine the landscape of Venice with the transparencies and the shades of glass, realizing a series of glass artworks with intense tones and shading. The bronze color, reminding us the famous paintings of Tintoretto, becomes even more precious thanks to the cold finishing on top, where the technique of battuto or inciso give the piece a complete different look.





CANNETO SERIES FASCE 2017



"Originality is going back to the origins." The best known aphorism of the great Catalan modernist architect Antoni Gaudí refers to the direct relationship of the artist with Nature as a source of inspiration, regardless of the influences imposed by cultural history, of the mediation of those who came before, and also of the artist's contemporaries. Thus Michela Cattai has landed on a medium such as glass, and on her work with the glass furnace, in order to give her own interpretation to images rooted in her memory, which are an integral part of her youth in Venice. These images are not just the outcome of the human mind—in a city. Venice, that is par excellence art and artifice—but of everything that surrounds it, the waterways, and the vegetation of the Laguna habitat, at times a desolate landscape, but always full of charm.

It's from these that derive her monochromatic vases, which in their essential nature exalt their vitreous makeup in the tonalities that recall the colors of the swampy waters of the Laguna at different times of the day and in different seasons. The blown-glass cane glass pieces, on the other hand, are inspired by the cane fields of the "barene" (lands that are periodically flooded by the tides) and were purposely conceived with an irregular upward thrust (unlike their natural counterpart, which has a perfectly linear shape), often beaten by winds and covered in mud, a constant presence in this habitat. The series Canneto is a highly suggestive collection, and it represents Michela Cattai's debut in glasswork. Not an absolute debut, but, rather, a return, a new spark of a young love, which, during the years of her educational training—at the Accademia delle Belle Arti in had brought her to the creation of some glass pieces in Murano.

While the source of inspiration for the series Canneto is the natural landscape of the Laguna, the material and the technique that distinguishes it and that makes it of such high-qua- lity are typical of the tradition of Murano, the Venetian seat of glass making, a tradition deeply rooted in history. The uniformity and the perfection of the webbing of the glass canes from the Renaissance, though, did not lend itself to recreate the canes of the marshes of the "barena," always mixed with sand and mud and partly submerged in the waters of the Laguna. Thus, Cattai has "dirtied" the glassy fabric with a layer of dark glass, which, similar to brush strokes, confers a paint-like texture of a decidedly contemporary style to the walls of the vases.
